

- Er Derby Allen passed thanks to all concerned for the arrangements made for Ex Serving Members to walk round ASW facilities on completion of the AGE.



BURBLES UNTIL HE ORDERS A SET OF (YES, YOU'VE GUESSED IT) YET ANOTHER JAAC PUB, THIS TIME JAAC PUB 4 VOLS 1 AND 2 (SONAR CLASSIFICATION GUIDE), PERSONAL ADVICE IS - ONCE YOU'VE GOT HOLD OF ALL THESE BOOKS - KEEP THEM IN YOUR SAFE AS OPPOSED TO LETTING THEM GET LOCKED UP IN SOME DARK, FORSAKEN CORNER OF THE OPS ROOM WHERE THEY WILL BE, FORGOTTEN ABOUT.

IN CASE YOU ARE HONDERING HHY I'M TELLING YOU ALL THIS. HELL, NON FOR THE BAD NEWS. IN ADDITION TO THE TRAINING TAPES, JAAC ARE ALSO PRODUCING A TEST TAPE (AT THREE MONTHLY INTERUALS) THAT IS MANDATORY FOR ALL SONAR RATES FROM J/S(S) UP TO CPO(OPS)(S), JUST TO MAKE SURE THEY ARE COMPLETED, SQUADRON AND FOF STAFFS HILL BE KEEPING A CLOSE EYE ON INDIVIDUAL SHIPS. TO MAKE THINGS EASIER, A TRAINING CARD - BASED ON SIMILAR LINES TO THAT USED BY THE PASSIVE RATES - IS IN THE PIPELINE AND WILL -HOPEFULLY - BE ISSUED SHORTLY TO ALL SHIPS IN ORDER TO ENABLE THE SENIOR ASHD ON EACH SHIP TO MONITOR THE PROGRESS OF HIS SONAR RATES. SO, AURAL ANALYSIS, WHICH HAS TAKEN A BACK SEAT FOR FAR TOO LONG, HAS - AGAIN -BECOME A VERY IMPORTANT CLASSIFICATION AID. ITS IMPORTANCE SHOULDN'T BE UNDERESTIMATED, ESPECIALLY IN 2050, SAGE AND SAFRON FITTED SHIPS.

HHILST I'M ON THE SUBJECT OF SAGE AND SAFRON, A QUICK PLUG. IF YOU'VE GOT IT THEN YOU KNOW ITS "BEES KNEES" IF YOU HAVEN'T - AND YOU'RE 184 FITTED - THEN SLAP IN FOR IT, IT NOT ONLY IMPROVES 184 DETECTION CAPABILITY BUT INCREASES YOUR PASSIVE CAPABILITY AND ENHANCES YOUR TRANSMISSION INTERCEPT PERFORMANCE QUITE DRAMATICALLY. FOR INFORMATION, ALL SONAR CAREER COURSES HAVE ACQUAINTS ON BOTH PIECES OF KIT AND A COMPREHENSIVE PUT IS RUN BY OUR RESIDENT INTERCEPT EXPERT PO SCOUSE "TRANNIES KING" RIMMER. THE SAGE PUT IS THREE DAYS AND

THE FISTORY OF PORTLAND

THE SAFRON FIVE, BOTH HUST BE ORGANISED THROUGH THE TRAINING PLANNING OFFICE IN DRYAD (EXT 4320). HOHEVER, QUICK TRANSMISSION, STRAIGHT FROM THE HORSES HOUTH "PING .. BIP.. FM RAMP.." IF THE SHIP HONT RELEASE THEM FOR A HEEK THEM A FEW DAYS IS BETTER THAN NOTHING AT ALL "PING.. RIIIIIIIIIPPLE..".

RIGHT, NUFF SAID, IF ANYONE NEEDS ANYMORE INFORMATION THEN PLEASE DON'T HESITATE TO RING ME UP ON 4568. (THATS THE SEA (S) COURSE OFFICE, BECAUSE HE ARE TEMPORARILY - I HOPE! - PHONELESS).

YOURS AYE

PORTLAND HARBOUR AND IT'S BREAKHATER HAS FIRST CONSIDERED IN THE LATE 19TH CENTURY AS A POSSIBLE HAVEN TO SHIPS HISHING TO SHELTER FROM THE SEVERE SOUTH HESTERLY GALES, THUS AVOIDING THE HAVIGATIONAL DANGERS SURROUNDING THE, BILL OF PORTLAND, THE HUMBER OF SHIPS LOST IN HEST BAY IS A TESTAMENT TO THE DANGERS OF HEST PORTLAND IN THE PREVAILING WINDS. THE ROADS TO THE EAST OFFERED PROTECTION FROM THESE HINDS.

A COMMISSION SET UP IN 1844 CHAIRED BY ADMIRAL SIR THOMAS BYAN MARTIN, GAVE THE DECISION TO BUILD A BREAKMATER TO THE EAST OF PORTLAND, BASED UPON FAVOURABLE EVIDENCE FROM ROYAL NAVAL SURVEYS, LOCAL SHIP OWNERS, EXPERIENCED SEAFARERS AND RESIDENTS. AT AN APPROXIMATE COST OF 500,000 POUNDS, PORTLAND HARBOUR AND BREAKMATER BILL MAS GIVEN THE ROYAL ASSENT, AND WORK BEGAN ON 1ST AUGUST 1847 UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF JAMES MEADOMS RENDEL, CHIEF ENGINEER, LABOUR FOR THE WORKS WAS PROVIDED BY 1300 CONVICTS FROM THE VERNE PRISON, SPECIALLY BUILT FOR THAT PURPOSE.

THE BREAKHATER HHICH WAS BUILT OF AN INFERIOR STONE, WAS TRANSPORTED BY SHALL RAILWAYS FROM THE QUARRIES SOME 300 FT ABOVE SEA LEVEL TO THE POINT WHERE THE BREAKHATER, JOINED THE SHORE. THE CONSTRUCTION WAS COMPLETED ON SATURDAY 3RD MARCH 1871, MEASURED NEARLY A MILE IN LENGTH, IS APPROXIMATELY 100 FT IN HEIGHT FROM THE SEA BED AND IS 300 FT THICK AT IT'S BASE. SURPRISINGLY ONLY 30 MEN DIED DURING THE CONSTRUCTION PERIOD OF 24 YEARS AND OF THOSE ONLY 5 DIED FROM DROWNING.

A MONTH AFTER THE BREAKHATER'S CONSTRUCTION A FLEET STEAMED THROUGH IT'S SOUTHERN ENTRANCE. THE HARBOUR SOON BECAME A REFUGE TO MANY MERCHANT VESSELS AND MEN OF MAR. HOWEVER AT THIS TIME THERE WAS NO INTENTION OF CONSTRUCTING A MAVAL BASE AND THE FORTIFICATION TO PROTECT ANY FLEET HAS DISCARDED ONING TO THE SALIENT POSITION OF PORTLAND.

NEVERTHELESS PROTECTION IT DID GIVE AND SHIPS BEGAN REHAINING ON A HORE PERHANENT BASIS. IN 1862 A TRAINING SHIP THE BRITTANIA ARRIVED AS THE FIRST TRAINING SHIP FOR CADETS LATER IT HAS DECIDED TO MOVE THE SHIP TO DARTHOUTH WHERE IT'S NAME REHAINS AS THE ROYAL NAVAL COLLEGE. A SUCCESSION OF SHIPS THEN FOLLOWED, HAS BOSCAWEN BEING THE FIRST. THUS PORTLAND BECAME A HAVAL TRAINING BASE FOR SAILORS AND CADETS. A PERHANENT ESTABLISHMENT WAS SHORTLY SET UP ON THE EASTERN SLOPES OF PORTLAND AND TOOK THE NAME OF BOSCAWEN. TEN YEARS LATER IT BECAME A GUNNERY TRAINING ESTABLISHMENT.

THE SHELTER OF PORTLAND HARBOUR PROVIDED EXCELLENT FACILITIES FOR NAVAL EXPERIMENTAL WORK TO BE CARRIED OUT.

THE EFFECTS OF GUNFIRE ON A HARSHIPS TURRET HAS CARRIED OUT IN 1872. EARLIER IN 1869 ROBERT HHITEHEAD BROUGHT THO TORPEDOES TO ENGLAND AND DUE TO THEIR SUCCESSFUL TRIALS AT SHEERNESS. THE ADMIRALTY ADOPTED THE HHITEHEAD TORPEDO BUT HAS ONLY PREPARED TO BUY THEM IF THEY HERE BUILT IN BRITAIN AND NOT IN AUSTRIA HHERE THEY HERE FIRST DEVELOPED. AS A RESULT A FACTORY HAS BUILT AT HYKE REGIS TO MANUFACTURE. THE HHITEHEAD TORPEDO AND A LONG PIER HAS CONSTRUCTED TO TEST THEM. IT HAS BECAUSE OF THE THREAT OF TORPEDO ATTACKS LATER FROM TORPEDO BOATS THAT THE HARBOUR HAS ENCLOSED HITH ADDITIONAL BREAKHATERS.

THE CONSTRUCTION OF THESE BREAKHATERS IN 1906 TOOK
SOME 16 YEARS TO COMPLETE AND A COALING PIER AT THE INNER
BREAKHATER HAS CONSTRUCTED AT THE SAME TIME. THE HARBOUR HAS
FURTHER DEVELOPED TO INCLUDE GUN BATTERIES AS A DEFENCE
AGAINST ENEMY ATTACK. THE COMPLETED HARBOUR ALONG HITH IT'S
FORTIFICATIONS HAS NOW A BUSY NAVAL ANCHORAGE.

DURING BOTH HORLD HARS, PORTLAND PLAYED A MAJOR ROLE IN NAUAL HARFARE.AT THE OUTBREAK OF HORLD HAR 1 THE HARBOUR HAS USED AS A HAR ANCHORAGE AND EXERCISE AREA.HITH THESE GROWING FORCES AND THE IMPORTANT OPERATIONAL HORK CARRIED OUT AT PORTLAND AN ADMIRAL OF FLAG RANK HAS APPOINTED; REAR ADMIRAL U H G BERNARD BEING THE FIRST TO BE IN COMMAND.

BETHEEN THE HARS FINANCIAL RESTRAINTS FORCED THE ROYAL NAUY TO ECONOMISE (A STORY HE HAVE HEARD SO OFTEN IN RECENT TINES), THE GRAND FLEET HAS ABOLISHED AND THE PORTLAND NAVAL BASE HAS FORCED TO PARTIALLY CLOSE DOHN, EXCEPT FOR THE CONTINUANCE OF ANTI SUBMARINE HORK, THE CONSIDERABLE HANDLING OF STORES FOR TRANSITTING SHIPS AND THE MAINTENANCE OF REFUELLING CRAFT AFLOAT.STRONG ARGUMENTS HERE PUT FORHARD FOR THE RETENTION OF PORTLAND BY THEIR LORDSHIPS NOTABLY ADMIRALS BEATTY AND DE ROEBUCK PHO STRESSED THE IMPORTANCE OF PORTLAND AS A NAVAL BASE. THEIR ARGUMENTS HERE NOT IN VAIN AND IN 1923 PORTLAND BECAME KNOHN AS HM NAVAL BASE PORTLAND. THE ANTI SUBMARINE SCHOOL HAS BUILT AND HMS OSPREY HAS COMMISSIONED IN 1924.SUBMARINE AND ANTI SUBMARINE TRAINING BECAME ONE OF PORTLANDS PRIMARY FUNCTIONS AS THE THREAT OF SUBHARINE ATTACKS IN ANY FUTURE HAR PRESENTED A SERIOUS PROBLEM TO SURFACE SHIPPING.

AT THE OUTBREAK OF THE SECOND HORLD HAR PORTLAND .

CONTINUED ITS FUNCTION AS A PRIMARY ANTI SUBMARINE TRAINING BASE, AND A BASE FOR THE CHANNEL FORCE. ONCE AGAIN IT CONTRIBUTED TO GREATLY TO THE HAR EFFORT, HORKING UP NEHLY COMMISSIONED SHIPS PRIOR TO THEIR DEPLOYMENT TO THE THEATRES OF HAR. PORTLAND ALSO BECAME AN OPERATIONAL BASE FOR COASTAL FORCES, COMPRISING LARGE FLOTILLAS OF NOTOR ANTI SUBMARINE BOATS, HOTOR TORPEDO BOATS AND HOTOR GUN BOATS. PRIOR TO D DAY A DECISION AHS HADE TO USE THE BASE AS A DEPARTURE PORT FOR THE INVASION FORCES.

AFTER THE HAR PORTLAND RETURNED TO IT'S PEACETIME ROLE. THE ANTI SUBHARINE SCHOOL HAVING LEFT PORTLAND DURING THE BATTLE OF BRITAIN IN 1940 RETURNED FROM LARGS IN

HARCH 1946.

PORTLANDS POST HAR ROLE IN THE TRAINING OF ROYAL NAUAL PERSONNEL BEGAN HITH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE PORTLAND TRAINING SQUADRON AND IN 1947 THE FIRST SUCCESFUL TRIALS HERE CARRIED OUT IN REFUELLING SHIPS AT SEA UNDERHAY, BETHEEN THE BULAHAYO, A FLEET REPLENISHMENT SHIP AND THE BATTLESHIP, DUKE OF YORK, THE CRUISER SUPERB AND THE DESTROYER DUNKIRK; THE FIRST OF MANY THOUSANDS OF REFUELLINGS TO TAKE PLACE AT PORTLAND OVER THE NEXT 40 YEARS.

PERHAPS THE HOST SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENTS HITNESSED, FROM PORTLAND IN THE IMMEDIATE POST HAR PERIOD WERE THOSE CONCERNED HITH THE FLEET AIR ARM AND HELICOPTERS. EXPERIMENTS TOOK PLACE IN 1946 TO SEE IF HELICOPTERS COULD LAND ON SHALL SHIPS. THIS HAS ACHIEVED BY USING A SIKORSKI RAB HOVERFLY AIRCRAFT HHICH LANDED ON A SPECIALLY FITTED HOODEN PLATFORM ABOARD THE FRIGATE HELMSDALE. IN THE SAME YEAR CAPTAIN R J SHAH ROYAL HAVY OF HMS OSPREY SUBNITTED A PAPER ENTITLED 'TACTICAL EMPLOYMENT OF ANTI SUBHARINE HELICOPTERS'. CAPTAIN SHAH BELIEVED THAT THE MOST IMPORTANT ATTRIBUTES OF HELICOPTERS HERE IN AN ANTI SUBHARINE ROLE. FLEET REQUIREMENTS HORK CONTINUED HITH HELICOPTERS DURING THE 1950'S.BUT IT HAS NOT UNTIL 1959 THAT RNAS PORTLAND HAS COMMISSIONED.

OVER THE LAST 30 YEARS A GREAT DEAL OF CHANGE HAS TAKEN. PLACE AT PORTLAND. THE COALING PIER CRANES HERE DISMANTLED. EIGHT MULBERRY PIERS HERE BROUGHT TO PORTLAND AND PLACED TO THE HEST OF THE HARBOUR TO PROTECT IT FROM THE PREVAILING HESTERLIES.SIX OF THESE MULBERRIES HERE SENT TO HOLLAND IN 1953 TO COUNTER THE SEVERE FLOODING THAT HAD OCCURRED.

IN THE EARLY FIFTIES A NEW DEEP HATER JETTY TO THE HEST OF THE EXISTING BERTHS HAS CONSTRUCTED, AND HAS NAMED QUEENS PIER OR "O" PIER. THE COALING PIER HAS PARTIALLY BUILT OVER, AND LAND RECLAIMED TO EXTEND THE HELICOPTER BASE.

LATER DEVELOPMENTS INCLUDE BUILDING OF A FLEET MAINTENANCE GROUP AT COALING PIER, NEH OFFICES FOR FLAG OFFICER SEA TRAINING AND ACCOMMODATION BUILDINGS FOR OFFICERS, HARRANT OFFICERS AND SENIOR RATINGS CLOSE TO THE AIR STATION. INDEED PORTLAND REMAINS AN IMPORTANT BASE FOR THE ROYAL NAVY TO TRAIN AND SUPPORT NOT ONLY RN SHIPS BUT' MANY NATO ALIGNED AND FOREIGN NAVIES IN MODERN HARFARE. INDEED ON ALMOST ANY DAY OF THE YEAR, SHIPS OF THE ROYAL NAUY, GERHAN, DUTCH AND BELGIAN NAVIES CAN BE SEEN HORKING UP UNDER THE HATCHFUL EYE OF THE FLAG OFFICER SEA TRAINING AND HIS STAFF OF SOME 87 OFFICERS, 118 HARRANT OFFICERS AND, SENIOR RATINGS, 15 JUNIOR RATINGS AND 9 CIVILIANS. HETHODS OF TRAINING DEVISED AND DEVELOPED SINCE THE LATE 50', EARLY. 60'S ARE EMPLOYED TO TRAIN AND TEST EACH SHIP AT THE " BEGINNING AND AT REGULAR INTERVALS THROUGHOUT A SHIPS COHMISION. HEAPONS, EFFICIENCY, MACHINERY, TACTICS, ORGANISATION AND THE PERFORMANCE OF PERSONNEL ARE SUBJECT TO SCRUTINY BY FOST AND HIS STAFF.

TO ENABLE FOST STAFF TO ASSESS THE EFFECTIVENESS OF A SHIPS TRAINING HHILST AT PORTLAND, THE SHIPS ARE INSPECTED ON THE FINAL DAY OF OPERATIONAL SEA TRAINING. COMPLEX, THREATS ARE INTRODUCED TO PROVIDE A CONFLICT OF PRIORITIES AND EVERY MAN IN A SHIPS COMPANY ARE INVOLVED. THE INSPECTIONS AND INDEED ALL EXERCISES ARE CONCLUDED HITH A HASHUP AND REPORTS ARE HRITTEN REFLECTING THE SHIPS PERFORMANCE. THE FINAL INSPECTION DETERMINES THE SHIPS OPERATIONAL READINESS TO JOIN THE FLEET.

DURING THE YEAR 1987 SOME 61 SHIPS HERE HORKED UP, THESE INCLUDED 36 RN SHIPS.10 NATO AND FOREIGN SHIPS AND 15 ROYAL FLEET AUXILLIARIES. IN THE SAME PERIOD 38 SHIPS UNDERHENT STAFF COVERED HEAPON TRAINING. SHIPS UNDERTAKING SYLLABUS TRAINING DUTIES TOTALLED 35 AND SOME 138 SHIPS CARRIED OUT VARIOUS FORMS OF TRIALS. DEPLOYMENT GROUPS AND. SHIPS OF THE STANDING NAVAL FORCE ATLANTIC ALSO UNDERGO TRAINING IN THE PORTLAND AREAS FROM TIME TO TIME. THE PORTLAND EXERCISE AREAS STRETCH FROM ANVIL POINT IN THE EAST TO START POINT IN THE HEST AND COVER AN AREA OF SOME 2400 SQUARE MILES.

THIS ARTICLE IS NOT ABOUT THE ACTIVE/PASSIVE DIVIDE, NOR IS IT ABOUT ONE PERSON EXTOLLING THE VIRTUES OF THE PSD. IT IS ABOUT "REAL WORLD" OPS. OBVIOUSLY THE SCOPE(!) OF THE ARTICLE IS SEVERELY LIMITED DUE TO THE UNCLASSIFIED NATURE OF THIS MAGAZINE; HOHEVER, I AM SURE THAT IT HILL BE CONTENTIOUS ENOUGH TO UPSET A SHALL-HARROH HINDED -HINORITY. IN ALL HONESTY, IT IS THIS HINORITY THAT THE ARTICLE IS AIMED AT, AFTER ALL, THE TRUTH OFTEN HURTS.....

FACT: ASH IN THE 1980'S STILL REMAINS AN IMPRECISE ART, HOHEVER IT STILL HAS TO DEAL HITH A HODERN THREAT THAT IS FAR HORE POTENT THAN THE HEAPONS THAT HAS UNLEASHED HITH SUCH A DEVASTATING EFECT DURING THO WORLD HARS. HYHT:

ASDIC HAS THE ANSHER THEN AND HODERN ACTIVE

SONARS REHAIN SO NOH.

FORGET PORTLAND AND SUBMARINES SAT IN LITTLE BOXES HAITING TO BE FOUND, I AM TALKING REAL HORLD. THE OLD ADAGE ABOUT ATTACK BEING THE BEST FORM OF DEFENCE HAS NEVER HORE TRUE, TO RELY ON ACTIVE SONAR IS VIRTUALLY ADMITTING DEFEAT STRAIGHT AHAY. TO FIGHT THE ASH BATTLE ON AN ACTION PLOT HITH IT'S NORMAL RANGE SCALE IS ABOUT A REALISTIC AS THE RP'S FIGHTING THE SURFACE BATTLE BY 'CLOSING THE RANGE AND ENGAGING WHEN YOU SEE THE HHITES OF THEIR EYES'.

SEA DENIAL IS THE AIM OF THE GAME, TECHNICAL CONSIDERATIONS HAVE CHANGED SINCE CAPTAIN HALKERS DAY AND YET THE MAIN EMPHASIS REMAINS ON PROCEDURAL TRAINING.

PASSIVE SONAR ONE OF THE HEARS OF SEA DENIAL) IS FAR HORE SENSITIVE AND EFFECTIVE THAN EVEN THE HOST TECHNICALLY ADVANCED ACTIVE SET. THE ADVENT OF VERY EFFECTIVE C3 FOR FFCH'S, MPA'S AND CARRIER BORNE AIRCRAFT RESULTS IN TODAYS HOST ESSENTIAL FACTOR, A GREAT INCREASE IN REACH. THIS IN TURN HEARS THAT THE AREAS CAN AND NEED TO BE COVERED ARE QUITE LARGE, MHEN THIS IS COUPLED TO HITH AN OPPONENT THAT IS GEOGRAPHICALLY CONSTRAINED THEN THE POTENTIAL FOR SEA DENIAL IS TREMENDOUS, BUT YOU NEED TO FRIGATES.

TO REITERATE FORGET SUBHARINES IN LITTLE BOXES, AN AREA OF 300-400 NH IS OF IMMEDIATE CONCERN TO THE COMMANDER OF A CARRIER BATTLE GROUP OR CONVOY; PASSIVE SOMAR - HHEN COMBINED HITH EFFECTIVE USE OF HPA'S, HELOS, ETC IS THE ONLY HAY OF DEALING HITH THE SUBHARINE BEFORE IT HAS CHANCE TO LAUNCH ANY OF IT'S ASSORTED STAND OFF HEAPONS AT YOU.HITH THIS - MUCH PUBLICISED - LAYERED DEFENCE NON TAIL FITTED SHIPS ARE USED EXCLUSIVELY FOR ' LAST DITCH' DEFENCE AS A PURELY DEFENSIVE SCREEN.DON'T FORGET WHAT I SAID EARLIER ABOUT THE BEST FORM OF DEFENCE BEING ATTACK, TO ATTACK AT IN THIS DAY AND AGE YOU HUST FIND THE TARGET AT LONG RANGE. NOT HHEN THE S/H IS ACTUALLY INSIDE THE SCREEN. IF IT'S INSIDE THE SCREEN THEN IT'S A CASE OF 'TOO LITTLE TOO LATE'. FACT: THE R N HAS ENTERED THE TA FIELD NHOLEHEARTEDLY HITH A HAJOR HARSHIP FITTING PROGRAMME CURRENTLY UNDERHAY DESPITE ALL OF THIS HARDHARE THE PASSIVE SUB BRANCH IS RELYING ON AN EVER DHINDLING NUMBER OF VERY EXPERIENCED SENIOR RATES TO GET RESULTS.
