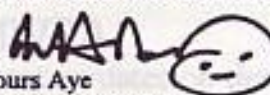

Since I last put fingers to the keyboard yet another change has occurred in the ASW weapon section. Jim Nelson has now left and is a "dammed student" on ASWSC course 14, and has been relieved by PO(S) George Maneey. CPO Nick Slater will be in this chair in the near future.

A few problems have arisen since I last updated you, they are highlighted below:

FOTI 0813 SAFETY CEILING SELECTION

The rules have changed again for the selection of the DEEP setting. The current rules were considered to be too restrictive and will be amended shortly. The safety area should be based on the submarines position and not the launch platform. The next FOTI change will reflect the new rules.

BR 8589(2) + (OSD)

After our last Tube drill meeting it was decided to re-issue the BR at the original state, but a change of mind has seen changes 11 and 12 issued.

There should be no further changes required until sonar 184 finally disappears from view!

STWS/MTLS/VECTAC RECORDING

You may or may not be aware that your records, after analysis by CTWA, are sent to FOSF and SMOPS so that we are kept up to date with problems in this area and can highlight any problems to the career courses and try to ensure that the same errors don't keep chopping up. It is becoming obvious from recent reports that BR 4023(3) is not being followed correctly.

The book is well laid out, with a chapter on records in general and separate chapters for STWS, MTLS and VECTACS, which are again sub-divided into sequence of events for your relevant AIO systems CACS, ADAWS and CAAIS.

Following these procedures will not only ensure you carry out the recorded attack correctly, but will also make the CWTA covering letter more pleasant reading and push your particular ship up that ASW efficiency prize ladder.

FINALLY if you have any queries on weapon drills and procedures or have any suggestions or comments on improving the CB's and BR's call us WE ARE HERE TO HELP YOU.

THE DRAFTING TEAM

The Revamp of NDD has seen a change of faces on the DIB drafting desk, although I remain your Drafting Officer. The Team now comprises:

Other members of the DIB team are LWWtr Sally LONG and Wtr Andy PARKER although these two have responsibility for other branches.

The MESSAGE

There was a time when drafting was just a task of shuffling people between shore jobs and sending them to sea, plugging gaps whenever they occurred by using a predetermined priority list. Today, with the Management Strategy that has been imposed on us, life for Drafty is very different indeed and we now operate to a new set of parameters requiring us to be more accountable for the financial implications of our actions. You are now a commodity, a valuable one at that, but more importantly you are costly to run and maintain, so in terms of 'value for money', we must optimise your use. We cannot afford to have a man additional in one place with a gap in another. In fact we cannot entertain surplus hence the latest redundancy round.

"Why are you telling me all this?" you might be saying. Well simply, I perceive it will get increasingly more difficult to achieve both our current success rate of over 85% IPRE drafts and also more difficult, even impossible at times, to achieve short term solutions to more localised problems - particularly those brought about by self infliction! The Round peg is not always going to fit into the round hole. If I have a gapped billet, I will have to fill it with someone who is additional, even if it is a NPPE draft. What I do intend however, is to ensure a fairer spread of the pain as possible within drafting constraints.

It is not all gloom however. Each of you can help me simply by keeping me informed of personal, ship, training or branch problems and concerns (If possible with proposed solution) - most importantly give us warning, as much as you can AND KEEP YOUR C230s UP TO DATE. Don't moan if your last DPC was in 1991, had Rosyth IPRE, you receive a draft order to go there, have since moved, married and had a family in Plymouth and no longer want to go North. That is for YOU to explain to your wife/husband

BOTTOM LINE - HELP US TO HELP YOU.

An Ex members view of a visit to HMS MARLBOROUGH

HMS MARLBOROUGH (TYPE 23 FRIGATE)

By kind permission of the Commanding officer of HMS Marlborough, CDR D R D TEER OBE, RN, the very good organisation of CPO(OPS)(S) Andy Gleave, serving in the ship, and the good offices of CPO(OPS)(S) R Drew, our Treasurer, a visit was arranged for Saturday 29th January 1994, when the ship was alongside at Portsmouth.

The following attended: Robbie Robinson, Tony Hovenden, Sam Snelling, Dave Bekker, Brian Heaver, Dizzie Dennett and John Adams.

To facilitate the moving of seven 'oldies' from the local areas as one and to avoid hassle from the MOD Plod at Unicorn Gate, and individual Portsmouth From 3's, a DIY minibus was arranged with Dicky Drew acting as Coxswain. This also allowed the Partaking of the Famous CSB (My first since Dec 78, lovely nectar!)

We arrived at FLJ at 1150 to find that Marlborough was outboard of HMS Westminster. Passing over the inboard ship, we were greeted by the OOD, a COP(OPS)(M), and our host Andy Gleave.

Passing through the screen door at the cross passage, we descended the ladder to the, I suppose, Burma Road, and all as one said, the smell of a Pussers ship is still the same as in our day. Proceeding For'd we were invited into the WO's and SR's mess. (No Warrant Officers on Ships books). What a difference, No bunks, (Separate cabins), a large recreational space with sliding doors to link with the Dinning Hall; these open up for Mess Dinner nights.

We were welcomed into the mess and suitably supplied with fully charged glasses of one's choice of beer. (the mess members were great, and we thank them for putting up with us.)

The walk around then ship was first class and an eye opener as to how things have changed, (a lot learned from the Falklands) E.L.S.A (Emergency Life Saving Apparatus and Fire Fighting equipment and Fire Safety curtains fitted at every compartment door, all equipment stowed, secured and resiliently mounted.

A savory subject, the Heads, gone are the urinals, only sit-down jobs and the following arrangements!! Before a button is pressed both seat and top cover have to be in the down position. At least with no urinals there will be less water(?) slopping about in heavy weather.

Proceeding Aft and descending a ladder we arrived at the Ops room. I recognised a few bits and pieces such as 162M, but the rest such as sonar 2050, STWS, UWT, the Captains, PWO's and ASWD's consoles were way beyond me and I have only been out just over 14 years (John, that stuff is way beyond some people who are still in!...Ed)

I was impressed with the Helo controller's area with a TV picture of the Flight Deck and the back end of the ship. We were cleared to view the Passive Sonar compartment and the associated equipment. FANTASTIC. (His words, not mine....Ed).

Back up the ladder to the Burma Road and aft to many compartments such as the MCR (DCHQ) and then to the Sonar 2031 Towed Cable Room, then to the Quarterdeck. I noticed that the QD was similar to that of the Type 42's I remembered. Difficult working the stern rope and back spring when you cannot see outboard.

We then went to the bridge, which was carpeted in blue! A good view of the gear on the Foremast and it was helpful having Brian Heaver with us, who just happens to be at DRA Portsdown working with the Type 23 set-up. Looking For'd from the bridge wing we had a good look at the Bow Anchor (the reason being, is the Sonar dome is below the forefoot). A 4.5" Mk 8 turret, Sea Wolf missiles are ranged to leave the ship vertically and a battery of harpoon missiles to fire to Port ann Star'b

After this walkabout it was necessary to take on more liquid refreshment, during this time Andy had arranged for the eight of us to meet the Commanding Officer.

Robbie Robinson had brought a book and a photograph of the figurehead of the Marlborough which was part of HMS VERNON when afloat. This figurehead is still at HMS Nelson (Gunwharf). Robbie qualified Torpedo Gunner's Mate at HMS Marlborough Eastbourne during WW2. It was a pleasure and a privilege to visit a ship that has a close connection with our old alma mater.

We thank the Commanding officer, Andy Gleave and those present in HMS Marlborough for making the visit memorable and thank them for their hospitality and also last but NEVER least Dickie Drew for taking us and getting us safely home.
