MINUTES OF THE ASWI'S ASSOCIATION

43rd ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

HELD AT HMS DRYAD 25th SEPTEMBER 1998

1. The meeting was opened at 1345.
2. Apologies were received from:

TASI Sam Snelling Portsmouth
WO(S) Pete White. HMS DRYAD
WO(S) Paddy Kennedy Gibraltar
TASI Dave Bekker Portsmouth
TASI Les Dacombe Monks Bell Coventry

The Secretary reported that TASI Sam Snelling was unable to attend as the Ex Serving Rep. as he had recently undergone major surgery and was still unable to fulfil his commitments. The meeting wished Sam well and hope for a speedy recovery.

3. Chairman's Opening Address

The Chairman welcomed the meeting and thanked those who had made the journey to Portsmouth, especially those from Banbury, Weymouth and Plymouth.

He reported that the year had gone reasonably well for the Association but there were concerns which would not only be addressed at the meeting but were a priority for all in the future, in particular funds and recruitment. He stated that recruitment, although picking up in the West Country, was waning overall and suggested that we all had a commitment to recruit, especially the younger element. He stressed it was his priority to make more

effort in spreading the good word to incoming PO Qualifying Courses, as they would be our future. He also asked members to do their part by contacting and persuading old friends and past members to rejoin.

He reported that the goodwill between the PRI Association and us had strengthened, liaison was good and our use of the PRI Clubhouse is about to be officially endorsed by our President Commodore HANCE. He stressed that although Bar profits were still being credited to the PRI's, the only way that the Association could share the Bar was to pay into it and buy up half the stock, something we were not in a position to do financially. One further step made into sharing the facility was the mounting of a new Association plaque, donated by Ex CPO(S) George Graham outside the clubs main entrance and an area set-aside for Association memorabilia. A vote of thanks for George Graham's generous donation was unanimously welcomed by the meeting.

The Chairman reported his concern regarding the production and distribution of the Seamaster Magazine and pointed to the lack of material, the geographic disposition of the Editor and out of date information especially membership lists as the main problems. He made his apologies for these shortcomings and stressed that all effort was being made to get it right. He stated that the Editor Ted Neeson had already hinted his resignation and asked for a volunteer to succeed if this was the case.

He stated that the "Paid Up Membership List" was almost up to date but anomalies were still apparent. He pointed to the Life Membership List as one for concern as insufficient data was available and asked those present and the membership to help in its compilation.

He further stressed that although Life Members were not required by the rules to pay an annual subscription, he would be asking them to make a donation so as to help Association Funds.

The Chairman went on to thank members of the committee for organising the Annual Dinner in particular CPO (S) George Emmerton, who was inconveniently drafted to sea and PO (S) Richie Tolton for implementing much of George's organisation. He also thanked Richie's Wife Ruth for providing us with a magnificent buffet during the lunch break, WO Jess Owen as the chairman of the Dinner Committee and asked for a vote of thanks to them all. The proposal was seconded by TASI John Adams and carried unanimously.

He concluded his opening speech by reminding the meeting that the venue for next years AGM and Dinner should be as tradition dictates held in Plymouth. However this was subject to the availability of a West Country Rep, as CPO(S) Tim Allport would be standing down before next years event. He also stressed the importance into planning early for the millennium AGM and Dinner.

Post Meeting Note: Bob Burton has confirmed that he will take up the challenge and organise the 1999 Dinner and AGM.

4. Acceptance of the 1997 AGM Minutes

The Minutes of the 1997 AGM were unanimously accepted as a true record.

The Chairman reported that because of Sam's inability to act as Ex- serving Members Rep. at the moment, Andy Gleave had taken over the responsibilities. He proposed a vote of thanks to Sam and again wished him good health and a speedy recovery. Carried unanimously.

Andy reported that it was his last working day in the Royal Navy. The Chairman on behalf of the Association wished him well and thanked he and Karen for their continued loyalty and hard work for the Association.

6. Treasurers Report

The Treasurer started his report by stating that having just completed the 6 monthly audit, the balance of Association accounts are not as rosy as one would like and went on to give a very professional and detailed account as to the problems we are encountering at the moment.

He stated that we are approximately £200 below the required £500 lower threshold, due mainly to ticket subsidies for dinner guests and an increase in our out goings for postage stamps, and audit costs. The matter of dinner subsidies was questioned by the meeting as it was believed that the dinner was to be self supporting. The Treasurer acknowledged this and stated that the association does subsidise dinners by allowing a differential in ticket prices. However he also recognised that we under estimated some costs, thereby incurring an additional burden on the association funds. He stressed that the only way to prevent any form of subsidy would be to set a realistic ticket price.

Richard went on to highlight the fact that our membership had waned a little, which accounted for a loss in membership subscription, and after taking into account our annual out goings the debit is nearly out-stripping the credit. He therefore urged members to vote for a realistic subscription fee (see Paragraph 11) as these have not risen for 6 years and are truly unrealistic. He stated that if the association was to survive it had to be funded properly. He mentioned that pegging of the subs fee to inflation may be a way of avoiding gloomy speeches in future.

Richard spoke passionately about the requirement to recruit, reiterating the Chairman's opening comments. He reported that the job of treasurer was not for the faint hearted but an important one that required dedication.

It was a job that cannot be walked away from, quoting "No Treasurer no Association". He informed the meeting that he was being drafted before Christmas, therefore would require a relief. When asked if a civilian could take up the post he answered yes but due to the fact that it was a Service Fund Account and a civilian did not come under the Naval discipline Act, there may be problems if there were irregularities. He also added that it would lay the ex-service member open to the demands of the service.

He also informed the meeting that Association funds were also being eaten away by audit costs. He reported that he is in the process of investigating ways to overcome having to have a service fund accountant to audit our books once a year, receive four interim audits and one surprise monthly cash check on such a small fund at a total cost of £90 per annum. He has taken up the question with the Finance Commander who has confirmed that we are to conform to regulations. However he is still pursuing the matter and hopes his efforts will be in our favour.

He concluded by stating that both the Finance Manager and Commander Finance were in our favour and would continue to look to ways of helping us to overcome the Audit problem.

7a. Social Secretary Report

In the absence of a Social Secretary the Secretary gave an account of the social activities for the year. He reported that it was a reasonably busy year with activities taking place during each term thereby providing an even balance. Events were generally well attended although the numbers for the 3-Monkey competition were disappointing albeit we came second behind the GI Association. The Association did however win the Porto Bello Golf Open, and the Quiz night versus the PRI's. The Skittles and BBQ nights were well attended and seemed popular events that will undoubtedly be repeated next year. The Dinner attendance, although down on last year (83 to) was pleasing although numbers from the serving membership was low.

The organisation for what was a splendid evening must be applauded and all credit must be given to CPO (S) George Emmerton the outgoing Social Secretary and to Richie Tolton who implemented George's plans and ideas.

West Country events continue to take the form of social meetings usually hosted by ships alongside. These are generally well attended and apart from a short period spent on Association and professional business, members were generally well fed and watered by their hosts and the Association would like to thank them all.

The Secretary went on to mention the Two remaining events for the social calendar, these being a Bonfire Night Social and a Christmas Drinks and Raffle.

He concluded his report by asking the membership to give thought to three main events, these being:

a. Confirmation date and venue for next years AGM and Dinner.

Bob Burton suggested that he might be available to take up the West Country Rep. in May next year, thereby putting him in a position to organise the Dinner in the West Country.

b. The venue, formats and date for the 3-monkey challenge

The meeting suggested that this could possibly be a two-legged affair with the second leg taking place in the West Country. After some debate it was decided that this was not feasible due to the lack of GI members in that area. The date however will be on a Saturday sometime in June or July at HMS DRYAD and will be confirmed at the next monthly meeting.

c. Venue, date and suggestions for a guest speaker at the millennium dinner.

After some debate three venues were proposed. Alan Yates suggested HMS Warrior and although there are some drawbacks with this venue it will be investigated.

HMS NELSON (VERNON Site) was also proposed along with a venue at Portland which would give a "half way" venue thus allowing for an even turn out from both Portsmouth and Plymouth.

All of these suggestions will be looked into and hopefully a venue that meets the needs of all will be decided sooner rather than later.

7b. West Country Report

Tim Allport reported that the West Country membership continued to support the Association well and to date there are 20 serving members and 8 ex serving members on the books.

Meetings have been generally well attended and averages 16, the numbers were very much dependant on the number of ships alongside. Thanks must be given to our hosts for the year in HM Ships: CUMBERLAND, MONMOUTH, NORFOLK COVENTRY, MONTROSE and SHEFFIELD. The remainder held in HMS DRAKE a popular venue for Skittle evenings and the attendance of family and friends.

Tim also reported that he had accepted non paid up members into the fold to encourage them to join thus advertising the fact that "Esprit de Corps has been visibly prominent in the West Country". He concluded his report by announcing that he was about to be drafted back to sea and would like a West Country Shore Based relief

(Post Meeting Note CPO Bob Burton will take over in May 99.

The Chairman thanked Tim for his continued involvement and stressed the fact that a good liaison continues to be maintained between Portsmouth and Plymouth.

8. Seamaster Editor Report

In the absence of Ted Neeson the Seamaster Editor, the Chairman reiterated what he had said in his opening speech that it was our aim to get things right with regard to membership lists, spellings and despatch problems. The latter has been made apparent by the fact that not all members receive their copy.

He described the new organisation by bringing Ted Lewis in to co-ordinate production, sending material from DRYAD to Ted in Southport after initial vetting. He again pleaded for material from the membership and stressed that without "Dits" a magazine could not be produced. He reported that hopefully the next one will be despatched in November ("Dits" forthcoming).

9. Secretary's Report

The Secretary stated that for him the year had flown by being kept busy almost daily trying to keep abreast of association business. (more than was anticipated).

He informed the meeting that generally correspondence had been steady over the year with some surprises notably the contact by former members, notably TASI Ian Gardner, TASI Les Dacombe, TASI Alan Yates and TASI Paul Hanneman all of whom (except for Les who sent his apologies) turned up at the meeting .

He informed the meeting that, job permitting, his aims for the coming year was to produce and issue new membership cards along with a revised Rule Book. The Rule Book is currently under review to hopefully fill in some loopholes and to update membership definitions and criteria. He stated that changes would be agreed at committee / monthly meeting level prior to endorsement at next years AGM.

He echoed the Chairman's pleasure of the progress made into owning (sharing) a Club HQ, adding that the wider vision of the current PRI leadership was to be applauded.

The Secretary concluded his report by raising the question of charities and the introduction of a charity Rep. He suggested to the meeting that he felt that if the Association doesn't take on a more active part in this direction, it will be seen as an organisation that doesn't do anything, whereas the GI's and PRI's do, thereby receiving more recognition and a higher profile in the PR stakes. He therefore welcomed suggestions for an adopted charity and a charity Rep. He did make it clear however that the charity was to be self supporting. After some debate it was suggested that it was not a viable plan at the moment and that the Associations priority was to "Keep Afloat". However the meeting did concede to the suggestion that if individuals were prepared to support and raise money for a Charity themselves then they could use the Association as a Sponsor. This suggestion received a favourable response from the meeting.

10. Matters Arising

- a. Annual Subscriptions ongoing (see para. 6 and New item 11b.)
- b. Removal of rule 17 Loyalty Bonus (Action Complete).
- c. Confirmation of the ASWI's Association Headquarters to remain at Portsmouth (Action Complete).

11. New Items.

- a. **To remove the disparity between Standing Order and Cash Payments for Annual Subscriptions.**

The Treasurer stated that the need give an incentive to those paying by Standing Order was not now necessary, therefore required amendment to allow for a single fee for all.

Proposed Richard Tolton carried unanimously.

- b. **To increase Annual Subscriptions to £10 per Annum.**

Ted Lewis reiterated most of what had been said by the treasurer with regard to the need to increase the Annual Subscription. He pointed to the fact that our annual outgoings were nearly outstripping our income and that the only way to reverse this predicament was to increase subscriptions to a realistic sum, in order for the Association function effectively. He pointed to the subscriptions paid by the other Instructor

Associations (£10 on average) highlighting the fact that they also received an income from bar and gaming machine profits.

After much favourable discussion where members again reiterated the need to recruit and that the Dinner should be wholly self supporting, **The proposal to increase the Annual Subscriptions to £ 10 per Annum as from 1st January 1999 was unanimously accepted by the meeting.**

Proposed WO Ted Lewis. Seconded Mr John Adams

c. To re-introduce a Treasurers monthly remuneration package.

The Chairman stated his concerns regarding the recruitment of a suitable treasurer as was the case prior to Richard Tolton coming in to relieve PO Kevin Francis. He stressed the importance of the job and the commitment needed to maintain the Associations funds, pointing out that it wasn't the size of the fund, but the upkeep of it and required someone special. He emphasised the fact that the job was not attractive in anyway and that it could be the ruin of a persons career if the books were not maintained correctly. He stressed that we need an incentive to recruit a treasurer and asked the meeting for suggestions and support.

After some favourable discussion the meeting **unanimously agreed that a Treasurers remuneration package of £10 per Month be**

implemented and that payment will only be made after a satisfactory probation period of 3 months and on the completion of one satisfactory interim audit.

Proposed: WO Peter Rhodes. Seconded: Mr Alan Yates.

12. Questions

a. Mr Alan Yates asked what progress had been made with the regard the selling of Association regalia (Ties, jumpers etc.)

The Secretary reminded the meeting that so far no one had come forward with ideas or had volunteered themselves to provide such a service. He pointed to the fact that the initial outlay for such articles could be high and if not sold on would result in a severe cash flow problem.

b. The secretary reminded the meeting of the kind and generous donation made by Ex Chief Sonar George Graham for the purchases of the plaque and proposed a vote of thanks to him. Carried Unanimously.

13. Date of the 1999 AGM and Close of Meeting

There be no further questions the Chairman again thanked all who had attended and wished everyone well for the Dinner and for the future. He anticipated that next years meeting will take place in Plymouth on 24th September 1999 and looked forward to seeing everyone there. He closed the meeting at 1525.

Just a quick line to let you know that I will be away on leave from Friday the 4th December until after the new year. If you are intending to send out a Seamaster for Xmas the following dates would have to be achieved:

To date I have not received a single item for inclusion nor any indication of what your intentions are, apart from those that were given out in your newsletter. I even received a copy of the Seamaster that was different to the one which I had put together, namely, a different front cover. I do not mind that a different cover was used but I spent a lot of unnecessary time producing, printing, and stapling together a booklet that was then dismantled and put together again with a new cover when all someone had to do was phone me up and tell me what was going on. The minutes of the AGM that were recently sent out in a newsletter seem to indicate that there was some criticism of my performance which had to be defended. I have never been made aware of any such criticism unless it is the spelling of ASWI on the colour front sheets, and even then I never saw any letters from members. Marconi spent £1000 getting those covers produced and never received one single word of thanks even though the mistake in not noticing the artwork until it was too late was entirely mine. In describing the appointment of Ted Lewis as "Co- originator"

you explain it as " to ensure that the Seamaster is topical and interesting" which would imply that it has until this point, not been. I realise that you did not mean anything personal towards me in your statement but you were however reflecting the views of the members which again makes me feel even more isolated and out of touch than ever before.

It is with deep regret therefore that I formally offer my resignation from the ASWI's committee and position of Seamaster Editor. The current situation is clearly not working and therefore requires a new approach. If ever there is a need for my services again in the future you can be assured of my utmost commitment to serve in whatever capacity is required.
